And it is no coincidence that Odessa boasts so many home-grown musicians of world renown: it could hardly be otherwise in a place with so many great musical institutions, such as the Conservatoire, the National A.V. Nezhdanova Academy of Music and the State Stolyarsky Music School which bears the name of its founder, Pyotr Solomonovich Stolyarsky, one of the most influential music pedagogues of the 20th century. Stolyarsky's pupils included David and Igor Oistrach, Nathan Milstein, Boris and Michael Goldstein (the writer Isaac Babel even took violin lessons with him although with more moderate success).

In the 1820s A. S. Pushkin wrote these lines about Odessa. In a city which was not yet thirty years old, there was already an Opera House.

The famous Odessan Opera plays an important role in the cultural life of the town. The Odessa Opera and Ballet Theatre has long since become a symbol of Odessa and is the most visited landmark of the town.

The Odessan Philharmonic is famous for its symphony orchestra, under the direction of principal conductor Hobert Earle. Leading the orchestra for almost a quarter of a century, Earle, a native of Venezuela, has raised the game of the Philharmonic such that it has become one of the world's top ranking orchestras (www.odessaphilharmonic.org/index.php).

Odessa regularly hosts various musical competitions, festivals of classical and operatic music (http://opera.odessa.ua/ua/festivali/) and also jazz festivals. The Jazz Festival celebrated its 15th anniversary in 2015 (www.jazzinodessa.com/). The Crimean Koktebel Jazz Festival has also moved to Odessa since the annexation of the Crimea and has taken place from 25–28th August 2016 in the village of Zatok in the Odessa Oblast (region).
